NEW RELEASE - DROP A COIN

With a dark pop groove that passes through a choral crescendo into the gaping maw of hell, 'The Open Flames' new single, 'Drop a Coin', introduces a surprisingly cinematic new band to the London scene. After racking up listens with teaser track 'Falling Up 1' they're finally releasing the first proper single from their debut album 'Same Time Next Year'.

Hauntingly catchy and propelled by Len Bendel's distorted bass over Evan Sult's methodical drumming, 'Drop a Coin' casts an alluringly dark spell thanks to singer/guitarist Dave Eastman's raspy storytelling and co-vocalist/guitarist Paige Brubeck's bah-bah backups. It's a stylishly restrained vibe that reveals a plot-twist second act, like an addictive TV show boiled down to 3:50 of pop power.

That's all by design. Eastman explains, "We wrote the song with the metaphor of paying a tithe to a blind girl sitting at the Gates of Hell to describe the hesitation before knocking on the door of your prom date, or a wedding chapel. It was inspired by the final moments of Ian Curtis of Joy Division before he passed into another life. The song's second half passes through the Gate to fly over a tormented landscape of Dante-esque souls who rise up howling from the fires and boiling muds of Hell."

Composed of members of US-based Sleepy Kitty and Harvey Danger (of 'Peep Show' theme song) and London's Say Yes, Do Nothing, The Open Flames bring equal parts attitude and experience to their rough-edged, literate alt-rock. Recorded during biannual sessions in London, 'Same Time Next Year' took shape via international listening sessions, focused practices and sometimes raucous hangouts. "The studio is where we get to lose ourselves, ditch the rest of the world, and make unreal things real," says drummer Sult. "We were playing the hell out of our instruments, and then Duncan [Thornley, engineer at London's MAP Studio] was playing the whole studio itself as an instrument. 'Drop a Coin' was the perfect example of that. It was the ideal way to dream an album to life."

'Drop a Coin' will be released everywhere on 4th October in advance of 'Same Time Next Year' in early 2025.
